DIRECTORS' REPORT.

To

The Shareholders of

AIR SERVICES OF INDIA, LIMITED.

Gentlemen,

Your Directors beg to submit herewith their Report and the Audited Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Account of the Company for the year ended 30th June 1948.

- 2. The Company's working during the year has resulted in a nett profit of Rs. 3,93,256 after charging a sum of Rs. 5,39,332 by way of depreciation on aircraft, machinery, equipment, etc. After deducting such nett profit from the balance of loss of Rs. 21,49,400 brought forward from previous years, the nett loss which is carried forward in the Balance Sheet remains at Rs. 17,56,144.
- 3. In arriving at this result, no charge is made in respect of remuneration payable to the Managing Agents of the Company, as they have been good enough, at the request of the Company, to waive their remuneration amounting to about Rs. 47,284 for the year under report.
- 4. The above result, though not satisfactory, shows improvement on the result of the previous year's working which showed a heavy loss. Though most of the unsatisfactory features confronting civil air transport operators in India continued unabated during the year, it has been possible to achieve the above result in the year's working owing to an accidental circumstance, namely, the abnormally heavy unscheduled operation of charters. While these casual operations brought about the above result, the civil air transport operators in the country are today more or less in the same unhappy plight as in the previous year so far as the possibilities of achieving economic working of regular scheduled services are concerned.
- 5. All operators of internal air services continue to operate them under provisional licences, permanent licences not having been yet issued by the Air Transport Licensing Board. Unfortunately, the authorities have not still been able to apply principles of rationalisation which underly the

air transport licensing scheme and to evolve and stabilise economic operation so vitally necessary to the very survival of civil airline operators who provide a second line of defence in times of emergency, as was proved when the Government decided to provide Military assistance to Kashmir State. At present ten companies are operating various routes which could be operated on an economic basis only by four or at most five companies.

- 6. Your Company has at every stage made suitable representations to the Authorities for securing determination and implementation of policy in the matter of putting civil aviation on economically sound basis and ensuring its development on right lines. It has been announced that the Licensing Board will take in hand the questions connected with the issue of permanent licences after the 15th December next. Your Directors will continue their efforts to secure adequate route mileage with possibilities of satisfactory traffic in order to achieve economic working as early as possible.
- 7. During the year under review, the Company maintained 100 percent regularity on all scheduled services except a very few cancellations on account of bad weather. In addition to the scheduled service between Bombay and Karachi via. Jamnagar and Bhuj, a duplicate service to Jamnagar and Bhuj via. Junagadh (Keshod) and Porbander was started during the year. The Bombay/Bhavnagar service which is operated with Dakota aircraft from 7th August 1947 has been extended to Ahmedabad. With effect from 26th July 1948 Indore has been included in the Bombay/Delhi service with satisfactory results. The Company has under contemplation suitable adjustments in some of these routes with a view to improve their working. In consulation with the Government of Saurashtra, the Company intends to provide suitable feeder services between various important centres in Saurashtra and other adjoining centres.
- 8. Your Directors have come to the conclusion that in order to secure economic working of certain services, it is necessary to operate them with an aircraft having a seating capacity of about 10 passengers. They hope to be able to purchase in the near future suitable aircraft answering these requirements.
- 9. During the year, the Company sold one Dakota aircraft to Government and one Rapide aircraft to another Airline. The Company purchased two small planes, one Tigermoth and one L-5 Sentinel for the purposes of giving training to pilots for which a scheme has been introduced. One

Tigermoth met with an accident near Daman, but the trainee pilot, the sole occupant, did not sustain any serious injury. The Company's fleet at the end of the year consists of 11 Dakota aircraft, 4 Rapide aircraft and 3 L-5 Sentinel aircraft.

- 10. During the year, the Company's operations covered a total distance of 17,19,209 miles and carried 43,790 passengers by its various services and charters.
- 11. Out of the total sum of Rs. 1,22,295 repayable to the shareholders on 48,918 shares at Rs. 2-8 per share under the scheme of Reduction of Capital, confirmed by the High Court by their order dated 12th March 1943, amounts aggregating to Rs. 1,17,232 have been duly refunded upto 30th June, 1948, leaving a balance of Rs. 5,063 which has been shown in the Balance Sheet under the heading of Liabilities for Other Finance. Those shareholders who have not yet claimed the amount due to them are requested to do so.
- 12. The Company's present fleet of aircraft, motor vehicles and stores, spare parts, etc. have been insured against accident and fire risks for the aggregate value of Rs. 47,78,200.
- 13. Three of your Directors, (1) Mr. Jamnadas Meghji, (2) Mr. R. E. M. Patel and (3) Sir Chunilal B. Mehta, retire by rotation, but, being eligible offer themselves for re-election under Article 104 of the Articles of Association.
 - 14. You are requested to appoint Auditors for the ensuing year and to fix their remuneration.
