

Bombay

Bombay The Gateway to India Bombay is situated on a peninsula jutting into the Indian Ocean. It has become the biggest commercial and industrial nucleus of India and one of the world's leading cotton centres. The population numbers almost 3 million of which 69% are Hindus, 17% Mohammedans and 7% Christians. The harbour of Bombay is the second largest in the Indian Republic and the best constructed on the west coast.

Bombay today is a modern commercial city. The main exports are cotton, rice, manganese, gold and natural wool. Its imports are textiles, machinery, automobiles, sugar and coal. Nevertheless, the city's aspect bears the imprints of the religion and the culture of the Hindus. This is illustrated for instance by the so-called "Hanging Gardens" and the "Tower of Silence", the burial place of the Parsis situated on Malabar



Hill, offering a superb view of the city and one, especially at night, which conjures to mind a veritable fairyland. Here one can perceive something of Indian culture and realize that India's civilization is one of the oldest in the world. From these hills you will certainly go on to visit the Mahalakshmi Temple and see the large crowds of the faithful offering prayers to the gods of the Earth and the Universe to the sound of strange music.

In the centre of the city are the Victoria Gardens, laid out in 1861, and the Zoological Gardens where children can delight in a ride on a camel or an elephant. This is not only an attraction for youngsters, but also for grown-ups. (Open 6.30 a.m. to 7.30 p.m.) Situated in these gardens are the Victoria and Albert Museums, one for industry the other for botany. (Open 10.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m., closed Mondays.)


